We visited Cuba on holiday last month and the same picture was plastered across whole facades amongst the splendid public buildings and crumbling ruins. Now I understand better the part he played alongside the Castro brothers in the Cuban revolution of the 50s in overturning the Batista regime and founding a socialist state, closely aligned with the Soviet Union.
