Aviation Group

Flying higher than airliners at nearly the speed of sound, manoeuvring at five times the force of gravity, and under radar at heights lower than a church tower - Squadron Leader Joe Marsden burned 1,000 gallons of fuel per hour in iconic Vulcan bombers and flew through nuclear fall-out. He was shot at by the Army, RAF and Royal Navy and lived to tell the tale. He has a wealth of facts and anecdotes of his 29 years in the Royal Air Force during the Cold War period.

Joe's talk this time will concentrate on the Vulcan - illustrated by photos and film clips to show its capability. He will briefly cover the history of the Vulcan but will mainly talk about the personal aspects of flying this famous aircraft. He will cover crew responsibilities, preparation and the practicalities of the various roles he was involved in without missing the more light-hearted aspects of the job in a journey which took him from Cyprus in the East to Midway Island and Alaska in the West as well as up into the Arctic Circle to test Russian response. Joe has flown 34 different Vulcan aircraft including XH558 which flew until 2016, and XL426 which is at Southend Airport being kept in ground-running condition to be taxied on occasions.





Monthly Talk - 8th November

The energetic and lively pioneer jet fighter aircraft pilot Sally Dearman was asked back by popular request to give another talk, this time on her move from jets to helicopters, popularly nicknamed Wobbleheads, because of the way they make the pilot constantly look around. Sally appeared again in her flight uniform and again at the end delightfully stripped off to reveal a charmingly feminine outfit.

Sally gave a fascinating, detailed, vivid account of her flying experiences, without notes or visuals, carrying us all along with her enthusiasm and exuberance. She began by reviewing her qualifications for flying, and then her training in flying jet fighters. Despite her excellent navigation, this exposed her lamentably poor sense of direction when undertaking intricate manoeuvering at high speed with her partner aircraft, and loss of orientation. She quoted only 20% of women as having good sense of direction compared with 80% men. In addition, aircraft performance degrades with height as the air becomes thinner, making complicated manoeuvring more difficult. Virtual bombing was practised over Wales, taking only 30 minutes to go from south to north, with a following plane taking photos to check accuracy.

Despite her pilot skills, because of her poor sense of direction, she was offered a career in helicopters instead, flying Chipmunks. As there was a ten month gap before starting training, she filled it by ferrying air cadets in a jet. This she greatly enjoyed and taught them aerobatics and cloud dispersal. Unfortunately, one cadet vomited in the middle of a loop and sent vomit flying everywhere, which she felt was her duty to clean up; an awful task. Sally herself felt sick as a passenger, and on one occasion actually vomited. Determined not to make another mess, she shut her mouth tight and swallowed. A loud "Ugh" came from her audience! This was a sensible step, returning her stomach contents back where they belonged.

Next Sally was posted to Shropshire Flying Gazelles, a lovely helicopter with excellent visibility; she longs to own one. Sally spent some time vividly describing, by her actions, the complicated flying of a helicopter with its various levers and pedals to go up, down, forwards and backwards without any joystick. An added complication is that all European helicopter blades have a clockwise spin, while USA ones go anticlockwise! The complicated technology in the cabin makes pilots constantly look around, hence Wobbleheads! Her lively presentation may have left others like me interested but baffled by the complexity. We learned that many Shropshire woods have holes cut in them for helicopter pilots to practise vertical take off and landing, essential for their work. They also had to practise flying onto boats and around cliffs and mountains, with their changing airflow problems.

Sally was posted to fly Wessex helicopters; very enclosed big heavy machines requiring a ladder to get in. The windscreen wiper was awful. They also required a navigator and crewman to help the pilot navigate. Sally did not like them, and did not say much more.

Sally also bravely told of her divorce, failed reconciliation, her depression and the great help she received from the Samaritans. She managed to recover by flying and is now in the Flying Reserve.

The large audience were delighted by Sally's excellent talk.
