## JANUARY MONTHLY MEETING

Rightly or wrongly, we have decided that the risks from the Omicron coronavirus variant are too uncertain for us to go ahead with the January meeting, where Gerald Ratner was due to speak. We shall seek another date with him when conditions are suitable.

In place of the physical meeting, we will be holding a Zoom meeting when the u3a Chairman, John Twydle, will talk about his experiences introducing CT (Computerised Tomography) to the NHS. CT scanning is equivalent to a much-improved form of X-ray which many of you may have experienced. Details of the virtual meeting are below. We hope as many of you as possible will join the meeting.

John Twydle trained at Middlesex Hospital as a Radiographer from 1972 to 1974. During 1976, he worked at Northwick Park Hospital in Harrow where the first Computerised Tomographic (CT) body scanner was installed. John will talk about the history of CT scanning and some of his experiences in helping to introduce this new technology to the NHS.
