# So You Think We Don't Make Anything Anymore? Britain's Manufacturing in the 21<sup>st</sup> century

After the Second World War, Britain was a world leader in many industries: no.1 in shipbuilding, motorcycles, jet engines, nuclear power; no. 2 in car production, computers and aircraft, just as examples. In 1950, Britain's share of world manufacturing was over 25%. By 2009, it was just 2.9%. Where are we now?

Much of the media reports negative news about British manufacturing but this could not be further from the reality, claims manufacturing systems engineer and industrial historian Richard Marks. In this talk, he looks at British manufacturing today and whether it really is as dead as the news would have us believe - or are reports of its demise greatly exaggerated?

You will be surprised at the current state of British industry!


