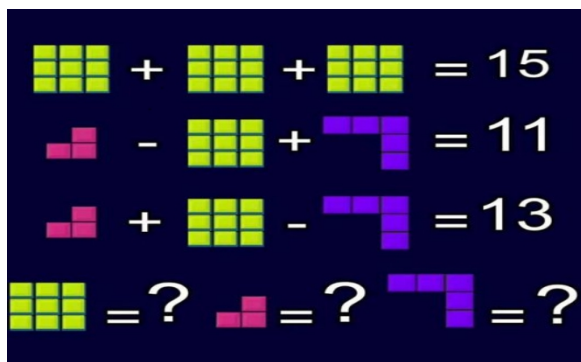

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## Simpler Times

Someone asked me the other day “What was your favourite fast food when you were growing up?”.

“We didn’t have fast food when I was growing up” I informed him.... All the food was slow! “C’mon, seriously...where did you eat?” he persisted. “It was a place called ‘at home” I answered.” Mum cooked every day and when Dad got home from work, we sat down together at the dining room table, and if I didn’t like what was on my plate I was allowed to sit there until I did like it.

I continued to tell him how I had to ask permission to leave the table. But there are some other things that I could have reminded him about my childhood too.

Some parents NEVER owned their own house, never wore Levis or trainers, never set foot on a golf course or had a credit card. Pizzas were not delivered to our home...but milk and newspapers were.

We didn’t have TV in our house until I was seventeen and of course it was black and white... and the station went off at midnight after playing the national anthem.

My parents never drove me to school as I bicycled to school or walked.

I never had a mobile telephone as the only telephone was on a ‘party line’. Before you dialled, you had to listen to make sure some people you didn’t know weren’t using the line.

There have certainly been a few changes in the films we watched in the cinema too. All films were made for everyone to watch without violence or most offensive language!!

We had a ‘Monday ‘wash day...Tuesday ironing and Wednesday housework and usually Friday shopping, as the ‘man of the house’ had brought home his weekly wage on the Thursday night.....and it all had to be allocated for Gas / Electricity / Rent / Insurance / Clothes Club and Food .....

Growing up isn’t what it used to be, is it?
