<u>Tickets</u> - Windsor & Maidenhead residents with an Advantage Card can enjoy **free access to the Show** on Windsor Wednesday and discounts across the rest of the week. Book your tickets with Windsor Information Centre either over the counter or by calling 01753 743589.

If not a resident of the Royal Borough Advantage Card Holder, entry is £10.

**Entrance**: Spaces are limited so we recommend booking in advance.

<u>Parking</u> - parking is available at the Show and is located opposite the entrance. Parking is on grass and is around a 5-10 minute walk from the Showground.

Parking: costs are £8+£1.50 postage in advance and £10 on the day. Book the car parking by calling the box office on 0844 581 0755.

Disabled car parking is located in the King Edward VII car park. It is available to blue badge holders only and must be booked in advance when booking your tickets. This is available at a discounted rate of £5. Disabled car parking can be booked by calling the disabled booking line on freephone 0800 640 5001.

There should be no issues with parking on the Wednesday.
