# Tuesday, 10th May 2022 at 2.30pm

In May, our speaker will be the distinguished economist Richard Smethurst. Former Provost of Worcester College Oxford and Pro-Vice Chancellor of Oxford University, Dick Smethurst was an adviser to Harold Wilson, Jim Callaghan and Roy Jenkins during the 1970s. Later he was Deputy Chairman of the Monopolies and Mergers Commission. For many years, Dick has given WEA courses on economics in Maidenhead. He will talk about his experiences in these roles and how crises impact economic policy.

The meeting will again be held at the Desborough Bowling Club at 10 Green Lane, Maidenhead SL6 1XZ (Green Lane is just off Stafferton Link and Bray Lane; there is plenty of free parking). Please aim to arrive between 2.00 and 2.15pm, wearing a face covering. Please remember to wear your u3a lanyard at the monthly meeting.



#### 4. CHAIRMAN'S REPORT – John Twydle

Our last AGM took place on Zoom amid a pandemic and while restrictions have almost been completely lifted, the virus is still with us in an even more infectious form but with fortunately less morbidity. I am proud of the fact that Maidenhead u3a has to a large extent remained active during the restrictions. Thank you to all those conveners and members who helped to make that happen. One thing that the pandemic brought home to us was the fact that we are social creatures. Zoom had its advantages but in the end, you can't beat a good chat and a biscuit to stimulate the grey matter.

Over recent years our membership has been stable around 600. It normally falls at renewal time, which largely reflects our ageing population and increases during the year as new members join. Following our latest renewal, we have approx. 490 members and we expect this to increase as our activities resume and soon reach pre-pandemic levels. We thank our Membership Secretary,

Maggie Kearney, for her energy and persistence in maintaining our membership in difficult circumstances.

The annual subscription has been returned to £16 for 2022. We have considerable reserves, and I would like to remind conveners that they are able to claim for any legitimate expenses that they incur in running their groups. Thanks to Linda for managing our finances.

The majority of our groups are back in action again and a few new ones have appeared. London Explorers Group Lead by Janet and Steve Rose has been particularly popular with visits to No.1 London, the O2 arena, the Albert Hall and Tower Bridge among the venues visited. Art Appreciation has been another popular addition with Mandy Taylor guiding us through a myriad of art objects and artists. Ukulele and Canasta are another couple of groups that have also proved popular. We thank and congratulate all those conveners who have kept their groups going throughout this difficult year and our Groups Coordinator, Kathy Bell, who has supported them.

The newsletter has made a huge contribution to keeping us connected. I'm sure you will join me in thanking Pat Laković and Nuala Smith for their energy and creativity, along with our poets, photographers, quiz masters and humourists who have raised our spirits throughout the last year.

Our normal SportsAble meeting venue was a casualty of the pandemic and as a result we had an enforced move to the Desborough Bowling Club. Normally 60 - 80 regulars attend the monthly meetings at Desborough and enjoy the social contact as well as the speakers. During the year we were entertained by such diverse topics as the British Raj, Roman Britain and where to find it and our former local Police and Crime Commissioner, Anthony Stansfield, sharing his thoughts and experiences with us. Thank you, Philip, for all of your efforts to find us excellent speakers.

We are members of the Thames Valley Network (TVN), a collection of some 40 u3as. They organise a wide range of speakers, study days and other events which we advertise in the newsletter and all u3a members can attend. Several Committee members have participated and found them to be excellent, but there is very little uptake from other members. We recommend these and some of you may find Zoom is an advantage because it removes the need to travel. We encourage you to participate.

The Committee has been very stable and has continued to meet every month in person or via Zoom, but as usual there will be a few changes at this AGM. During the year, Maggie Kearney, was co-opted to the Committee to relieve Linda Main of the Membership Secretary role, leaving Linda as Treasurer. The Newsletter is a major effort and we also co-opted Nuala Smith in support of Pat Laković. Both these members have been valuable additions to the team, and I commend them to you to retain them on the Committee. With the passing of Jean Myhill, Mandy Taylor has offered to join the Committee to take over the role of Thames Valley Network Rep. Derek Searle has also agreed to offer his services to the Committee, initially without portfolio.

It has been a pleasure to work with this team this year and I would like to record my formal thanks to Janet who has, as Secretary, kept us well organised this year, as all the members of the team for all the effort they have put in.

The success of our u3a is entirely what we make of it. Our Christmas party last year was a good example where many members of the team worked together to lay on an excellent afternoon of music and dancing.

#### 5. TREASURER'S REPORT - Linda Main

The accounts have been examined by Graham Clark, our new Independent Examiner, and the signed accounts are available for any member who wishes to see them. An extract will be published in the May 2022 newsletter.

The accounts include a more extensive report (than that which will be included in the May newsletter) and this is in line with the Charity Commission's current best practice.

Another exceptional year for our u3a due to the challenges of the Covid pandemic. Under the government's social isolation guidance (and also bearing in mind the vulnerability of our members) we were still able to keep many of our activities alive to some degree.

Over the years since our inception in 1998, we have consistently made a surplus over each financial period. However, at the end of 2020, the Committee agreed to try to cut this surplus by reducing the membership fee to £8. This was partly in acknowledgement that our activities in 2020 had been substantially limited. We left the option open to pay £16, the additional £8 to be classed as a donation. This reduction in membership fees also reduced our gift aid income.

You will therefore note that the cash at bank has decreased by £2,274, representing the reduction in income over expenditure during 2021. This results from a reduction in membership of around 70 people, membership fees reduced by half and income from Gift Aid down significantly. Overall income was down by £5,696 on 2020 and £9,596 on 2019 (in 2019 and 2020 there was no income from outings).

With the exception of the newsletter, nearly all normal costs were reduced when compared to pre-pandemic years. We sourced a new venue for our monthly group meetings at a reasonable cost and these meetings were resumed mid-year. The Committee agreed to host a Christmas party at the end of 2021 and this was a huge success. We received donations from members allowing us to purchase of a copse – 100 trees for the u3a Woodland Appeal in the Brecon Beacons.

At the end of 2021, the Committee agreed to reinstate membership fees to the pre-pandemic level of £16. This was in recognition of the resumption of normal meetings. I would like to thank Graham Clark for examining our accounts, and I would propose we use his services again to review the accounts for 2022. While we have seen a reduction in our income in 2021 and a reduction in our financial assets, this was intentional. Maidenhead u3a remains in a strong financial position.
