## Monthly talk

I am pleased to announce that **Anthony Stansfeld**, until recently Police and Crime Commissioner for the Thames Valley, will give the monthly talk in November. Entitled

## 'Nine years as Police and Crime Commissioner for the Thames Valley'

his talk will cover the background and qualifications to his becoming the PCC, and what being PCC involved: responsibilities, area covered, Chief Constables, national roles etc. He has some trenchant views on how fraud is being tackled.

Anthony Stansfeld was born in West Berkshire. He joined the Army at 17 and saw active service in Borneo and Northern Ireland. He later learnt to fly helicopters and commanded various Army Air Corps squadrons, including in the Falkland Islands in 1982. He spent two years as Chief of Staff Intelligence in the Far East.



On leaving the Army, he was for six years Managing Director of an aircraft company and in his spare time, he commanded the Territorial Army reserve helicopters. He was, for eight years, a trustee of the Thames Valley Air Ambulance.

He has an MSc and studied international terrorism and global security in depth at university. He was a member of the Thames Valley Police Authority for several years and became the first elected Thames Valley Police and Crime Commissioner in 2012.

The monthly talk will again be held at the Desborough Bowling Club at 10 Green Lane, Maidenhead **SL6 1XZ** (Green Lane is just off Stafferton Link and Bray Lane; there is plenty of free parking). Please aim to arrive between 2.00 and 2.15pm.

## **General Data Protection Regulations (GDPR)**

On the 25<sup>th</sup> of May 2018 the new GDPR regulations become Law in the UK. This legislation updates the Data Protection Act of 1998.

Under that legislation the committee have a duty to inform our members of their rights under GDPR legislation, alongside informing you what data we hold, and who we share that data with.

We collect your data on the basis of you becoming a u3a member and us delivering membership services as part of a contract.

If you chose not to share your data with us there is no way we can deliver those services to you.

The data we collect is your name, address, telephone number, eligibility for Gift Aid and e-mail address (where applicable) which in turn allows the generation of your membership number.

The data controller for Maidenhead u3a is Linda Main, our Treasurer. (treasurer@maidenheadu3a.org.uk)

This data is used to communicate with you regarding the activities of u3a and the maintenance of your membership.

Internally your data is shared with those members of the committee who have a valid interest and with some convenors where relevant.

Your data is kept as long as you are a member and will be deleted in a timely fashion if you choose to cease membership. The only exception to this is our communication with HMRC related to our Gift Aid claims, where there is a legal requirement for us to keep those records for seven years.

Externally, your data is shared with the Third Age Trust so they can deliver Third Age Matters magazine to you, our printers where your newsletter is delivered by post, and HMRC if we collect Gift Aid on your subscription.

You have the right to see what data we hold on you and to have that data deleted. You have the right to object to the way we process your data. You also have the right to lodge a complaint to the Information Commissioners Office. <u>https://ico.org.uk</u>

**Aviation:** Speaker will be Mark Davis and the subject will be the Air Transport Auxiliary, based at White Waltham during WW II and operated mainly by female pilots. The talk will also follow the post war achievements of some of the best known of these.

**Classical Music:** After a successful and enjoyable first meeting, we meet this month at Shirley's (01628 527604). Please let her know if you intend to come.

We would like a few more members, so anyone interested in listening to classical music will be most welcome; and we do break for tea and a chat!

**French Advanced:** French Advanced has now resumed and we meet at 15.00 on 3<sup>rd</sup> Thursday of the month in members' houses. Currently we have only four participants so we would welcome more but they must have a high level of fluency. Chris and I have French degrees, Arnold has a French wife, and Kay is bilingual.
