'Net Zero - A Critique' Neil Record

Climate Change is an important topic that we have not addressed recently in our monthly talks. Our speaker in November will be **Neil Record**, a British businessman, author and economist. Neil was one of the pioneers of currency risk management, writing the first textbook on the subject. After working at the Bank of England and the private sector, he set up his own financial business which presently manages over \$80 billion in currency exposures for corporate clients. Until recently Neil was Chairman of the Institute of Economic Affairs, and was a visiting fellow at Nuffield College, Oxford. He is a supporter of the think-tank the Global Warming Policy Foundation which is sceptical of catastrophic anthropogenic climate change.

Neil will critique the concept and policy of achieving Net Zero emissions by 2050, a matter of vital national and international significance, and one of considerable controversy with huge implications for costs and allocation of scarce resources.

The talk will be held at the Desborough Bowling Club at 10 Green Lane, Maidenhead SL6 1XZ. Please aim to arrive between 2.00 and 2.15pm. To avoid problems with parking, please share rides if possible. You may park in the spaces for buses. If the bowling club car park is full, you can park in front of Lidl or Homebase which are a short walk away for up to two hours, ideally having made a purchase.
